


Wedding

You will look back at the photographs of the wedding or perhaps the videos. What will you see? Perhaps Uncle Charlie and your best friend, both of them a little inebriated on the dance floor? (How memorable!)

But besides the people, the most prominent thing in those photos will be the decor--the floral decorations. The bouquets, the centerpieces, etc.... These are the things that will be the most obvious.... You may not remember the food. You will see and therefore better remember the flowers. They will become a large part of your memory picture...

If you are thinking of eliminating or cutting back your flowers, be forewarned..... Your wedding memories will definitely reflect----for better or for worse-----the floral art present on that most special day of your life. Not a smart thing to minimize or cut back on.....

Centerpieces	Can be viewed from all sides--- are great on reception tables.
Everyday Designs	Can, if viewed all the way around, be used as centerpieces as well.
Extremely Easy Designs	Wonderful for someone seeking quick and easy arrangements.....
Party Designs	Ideal for buffet tables. Can be used for seating plan tables, gift tables, decorations for an entry area or even the bathrooms.
Line Arrangements	Ideal for buffet tables. Can be used for seating plan tables, gift tables, decorations for an entry area or even the bathrooms. Also possible use on altars.
Romantic Designs	Ideal for buffet tables. Can be used for seating plan tables, gift tables, decorations for an entry area or even the bathrooms. If viewed all the way around may be used as table centerpieces for the reception.
Seasonal Designs	Can be used to help underscore a seasonal theme for a wedding.
Rose Designs	The rose is the ultimate symbol of romance. Anything with roses can be adapted for wedding use. If it is meant to be viewed all the way around it can be used as a centerpiece. If it is one sided it can be adapted for seating plan tables, gift tables, decorations for an entry area or even the bathrooms.

Rather than repeating scores of designs from these other categories, it makes more sense for you to refer to those other categories for ideas for centerpieces, buffet table ideas, etc.

There is, however one category of designs that has not been summarized in any of the other sections, and we will list them here.....namely wedding bouquets.

Wedding bouquets are, of course, an important form of floral art. They are carried by the bride, maid of honor and by bridesmaids. They may vary in size, content and color.





